Learning Journey

English – In English we will continue reading Iron Man by Ted Hughes. During our writing lessons we will be writing a wanted poster for the Iron man and a winter poem.

Maths – In maths we will be finishing out unit on addition and subtraction and then focussing on multiplication of division of two-digit numbers by a 1-digit number. We will also be looking at different units of measurement.

Science – In science the children will be looking at forces and magnets and planning our own investigations.

History – In history we will be thinking about the secrets of Stonehenge and why we think it was built. We will also be looking at the Iron Age and understanding how they lived.

Design and technology- In DT we will be creating our own stone/iron age hunting pouch.

Computing- In computing we will be learning about moving animations an creating our own using a selection of frames.

PSHE- In PSHE we will be looking at the importance of respect for others, family trees, mindfulness and exploring the similarities and differences between people.

PE- In PE we will be doing dance and gymnastics.

Spanish- In Spanish the children will be learning about classroom objects as well as Christmas traditions.
