# Our updated approach to behaviour...

As you are aware, we have adapted our approach to behaviour. Key adaptations include:

- Good to Be Green is no longer displayed in classrooms (removing the physical cards)
- Updated/relaunched the house system
  - House points have replaced Dojo points
- We are focusing and rewarding the positives (linking to our Core Learning Characteristics)
- We are now communicating red cards

Our approach/strategies may have adapted slightly, but our expectations of behaviour still remains the same.

#### **Attendance:**

We recognise the importance of attendance. If children aren't in school, they aren't learning, which means they aren't making progress.

We are in the process of reviewing and updating the way we reward attendance. We are looking at rolling out incentives and rewards for children with high school attendance, including vouchers. We have recently launched the use of stars in planners to recognise 100% attendance.
